



Section 4 : Concerning Salvation/Redemption

Question 5: When does redemption take place?

Answer 5: Redemption is secured the moment the sinner believes, and is realized when he receives his new body.

Memory Verse: **John 1:12**
But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God even to them that believe on his name:

Support Verses: **Colossians 1:13-14**
13 Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son:
14 In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:

Romans 8:23
And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body.

1Corinthians 6:19-20
19 What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?
20 For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

Ephesians 1:13-14
13 In whom ye also *trusted*, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,
14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

Discussion Points:

1. Redemption secured:

- Redemption is a process that is initiated with a payment, applied when the payment is received, and realized at a later time.
- The price of redemption was paid by The Lord Jesus Christ when He shed His blood on the cross.
- That payment is applied to man the moment he believes.
- The moment the payment is made the blessings of redemption are secured by the believer.
- The blessings that accompany redemption are hope, acceptance, worth...



- The believer's ransom is paid and his standing changes from bondage to freedom, from darkness to light, lost to found.
- The believer can now rest in the blessings of redemption in this life and the promise of complete redemption for the next.
- His soul has been secured, his identity has been transformed, by the transaction that was made through redemption. Redemption realized:

2. Redemption realized:

- The redemption, though paid for at Calvary, and secured by the believer by faith at the moment of salvation, is not fully realized until our bodies are changed (glorified) and our spirit is perfected.
- It is as though the full payment has been made but you have not been able to move in to your new and final dwelling yet.
- One day, you will receive, based on the faith you exercised to the salvation of your soul, your temple "not made with hands, eternal in the heavens."
- What a day that will be! We will be like Him!
- His work of restoration will be completed in us and it will be as He originally designed.
